Once the pre-expedition reservation window has elapsed, Shore Excursions may only be selected once aboard the yacht. Payment is not required at the time of reservation. The cost of reserved Shore Excursions will be charged to your onboard account with the exception of Specialty Tours, and any pre- or post-expedition services that will require immediate payment once added to your booking.

Shore Excursions may require a minimum number of participants to operate as described. If this minimum is not met, Atlas Ocean Voyages® reserves the right to cancel the excursion.

SHORE EXCURSION & PORT CHANGES

All Shore Excursions are subject to change or cancellation, and their itineraries are subject to change depending on traffic and/or weather conditions. Additional ports may be added, or ports shown in this book may be removed, subject to availability.

SHORE EXCURSION DEPARTURE TIMES

Shore Excursion departure times noted in this document are approximate. Exact departure times will be communicated once on board the yacht. AM or PM schedule noted may vary by port and expedition.

ATLAS IMMERSIVE EXPERIENCE TERMS

FREE Atlas Immersive Experiences (formerly known as Cultural Immersions) are capacity-controlled and are subject to change at any time without notice. Departure times mentioned may vary by port and expedition.

SPECIALTY SHORE EXCURSIONS

Due to certain unique requirements, Specialty Shore Excursions must be booked and paid in full up to 30 days in advance of sailing. Specialty Shore Excursions are non-refundable, and are not available to book once aboard the yacht. Specialty Shore Excursions may have additional requirements, such as providing passport information. Check the Please Note section of each Specialty Shore Excursion for additional details. Specialty Shore Excursions are labeled with Specialty Excursion before the tour name.

SHORE EXCURSIONS ON FIRST TWO DAYS OF SAILING

If guests are interested in a Shore Excursion that occurs during the first two days of the voyage, we strongly recommend pre-booking before the expedition, as these Shore Excursions may be fully booked by the time guests board the yacht.

SHORE EXCURSION CANCELLATION POLICY

Cancellations for shore excursions operating on days 1 and 2 of the cruise can only be made up to 14 days before departure. Once on board, tours on day 3 and beyond are eligible for cancellation up to 48 hours before the tour departure date.

HOTEL CANCELLATION POLICY

Hotel refunds are not eligible within 120 days. The same cancellation policy applies to Overland and Pre- or Post-Expedition Programs.

SHORE EXCURSION ACCESSIBILITY

Select tours offer access for wheelchairs. However, this must be requested in advance, and in some cases, additional expenses may be incurred when specialized equipment or vehicles are required to accommodate the guest. Not all tours offer the option for guests with limited mobility. Alternatively, a private tour request may be developed to accommodate the guest's needs upon request and for an additional cost.

MINORS POLICY

Guests under 18 years old may participate in excursions where wine, spirits and other alcoholic drinks are served unless otherwise indicated, but they will only be permitted to consume non-alcoholic beverages.

A WALK THROUGH THE VIKING CITY

HIGHLIGHTS

- Begin in Waterford's Viking Triangle, where six historic monuments reflect over 800 years of conquests and medieval life.
- See Reginald's Tower, the city's oldest structure and former stronghold of its Viking founders.
- Tour the Medieval Museum, home to Ireland's only dedicated medieval collection, including the Choristers' Hall and Mayor's Wine Vault.
- Witness a coin-minting demonstration recalling the city's Anglo-Norman heritage inside this state-of-the-art museum.
- Visit the Bishop's Palace to view treasures like the Bonaparte Mourning Cross and the earliest piece of Waterford Crystal.

DESCRIPTION

Set forth from the pier on a short drive to the venerable city of Waterford, established by seafaring Vikings over a millennium ago. Your exploration commences in the city's historic core, the Viking Triangle, where the echoes of ancient conquests and medieval sagas resound. Wander amidst six historic monuments that have stood the test of time, from the 12th to the 18th centuries, including the formidable Reginald's Tower, once the linchpin of the city's defenses.

Venture to the esteemed Medieval Museum, home to a grand sculpture inspired by a 13th-century relic. Within its walls, you'll find Ireland's only museum dedicated to medieval life, housing the hallowed 13th-century Choristers' Hall and the 15th-century Mayor's Wine Vault. Within this modern structure, witness the meticulous craft of coin minting, dating back to the Anglo-Norman era. The journey culminates at the stately Bishop's Palace to traverse the timeline of Waterford's storied past from 1700 through the 1970s. Amidst a collection of illustrious artifacts, discover the beauty of the Bonaparte Mourning Cross and gaze upon the 1789 Penrose Decanter, the pride of Waterford Crystal.

Please note: Expect an extensive amount of walking and standing for approximately three hours, with a few steps to negotiate to get on and off the coach. This tour is not suitable for guests in wheelchairs or those with limited mobility.

COUNTRYSIDE DRIVE & IRISH PUB

- Admire the rolling farmlands set against the backdrop of the Comeragh Mountains in the heart of Waterford County.

DESCRIPTION

Enjoy a scenic journey through County Waterford's breathtaking Atlantic vistas as you travel to Tramore, a quaint seaside gem where Victorian elegance meets the wild Irish coast. The Gaelic name, translating to 'large beach,' barely does justice to the sprawling bay framed by time-honored terraced homes. Tramore is one of Ireland's most popular seaside resort towns and has flourished since the 1850s, when it was linked to Waterford by rail.

Your adventure continues westward, tracing the craggy cliffs through vibrant villages like Fenor and Annestown. Immerse yourself in the history of the Copper Coast, a nod to the bygone era of copper mining near Bunmahon, and witness how the past has shaped the present. As the landscape transitions to the rolling pastures against the backdrop of the Comeragh Mountains, the heart of Waterford County reveals itself. Here, amid the verdant fields and traditional farmlands, pause at a classic Irish pub to enjoy a refreshing beverage, the captivating strains of Irish music, and the warm embrace of local hospitality.

Please note: This tour is suitable for guests in wheelchairs or those with limited mobility that can get on and off the coach unassisted or with the help of an able-bodied companion.

WATERFORD CRYSTAL & IRISH COFFEE

DESCRIPTION

Journey to the historic heart of Ireland's Viking ancestry in Waterford. As you traverse the landscapes that once welcomed Celtic tribes and Norse invaders, discover the city's etymological heritage, tracing back to the Norse *Vadrefjord*. Your panoramic drive offers a view of Reginald's Tower, a Viking bastion from a millennium ago, later claimed by Norman invader Strongbow. This enduring edifice stands as a testament to the city's turbulent and storied past.

In contemporary times, Waterford shines as the Crystal City. Your visit to the House of Waterford Crystal is an illuminating encounter with exquisite craftsmanship. Although the famed factory's operations have scaled down, the legacy endures in the sparkling showrooms. In the exhibition area, witness the meticulous artistry that goes into each piece, and in the retail shop, browse the world's most extensive collection of Waterford Crystal. Culminate your cultural expedition with the warmth of a classic Irish Coffee in the inviting ambiance of a local hotel.

SUMPTUOUS CURRAGHMORE HOUSE & GARDENS

- Admire the stately elegance of Curraghmore House, a historic estate set amid 2,500 acres of gardens, woodlands, and pasture.

- Visit the ornate Shell House, decorated in 1754 with thousands of seashells arranged in intricate geometric patterns.
- Enjoy a scenic drive along Waterford’s Copper Coast, where dramatic headlands and sea views complete your afternoon.

DESCRIPTION

Enjoy an afternoon infused with Old World elegance as you journey to Curraghmore House & Gardens, one of Ireland’s most distinguished private estates. Set amid rolling countryside, this stately home is the largest private demesne in Ireland, encompassing approximately 2,500 acres of formal gardens, woodlands, and grazing fields. Originally established by the de la Poer family after 1167, the house was extensively remodeled in the 18th century following its inheritance by Catherine de la Poer and her husband, Sir Marcus Beresford.

As you explore the estate, admire its refined architecture, opulent interiors, and carefully designed gardens, all reflecting centuries of aristocratic life. A highlight of the visit is the remarkable Shell House, built in 1754 by Catherine de la Poer herself. Its walls are intricately decorated with seashells gathered from around the world, creating a unique and personal expression of 18th-century craftsmanship. The property remains the family home of Lord Henry Waterford and his wife, who continue to preserve this historic residence. Your experience concludes with a scenic return drive along Waterford’s Copper Coast, where stunning coastal views provide a fitting finale to an afternoon steeped in history, beauty, and refinement.

QUAINT ÎLE DE RÉ

HIGHLIGHTS

- Stroll Saint-Martin-de-Ré's cobbled streets, framed by 17th-century Vauban fortifications and centuries-old homes.
- Enjoy free time to shop or relax in a café as you soak up the charm of this postcard-perfect island capital.
- Visit Ars-en-Ré, a whitewashed village known for its salt marshes, green shutters, and distinctive black-and-white church spire.
- Pass through La Flotte-en-Ré and glimpse the haunting ruins of 12th-century L'Abbaye des Châteliars.

DESCRIPTION

Savor the coastal charm of Île de Ré, a beloved retreat known for its sandy beaches, picturesque villages and medieval ruins. Cross the bridge from La Rochelle and arrive in Saint-Martin-de-Ré, the island's postcard-perfect capital. Stroll along cobblestone streets lined with 300-year-old houses and framed by Vauban's remarkable 17th-century fortifications, built to defend against British incursions. After your guided exploration, enjoy free time to browse local shops or relax at a café.

Continue north to Ars-en-Ré, ranked among France's most beautiful villages. Surrounded by salt marshes and encircled by the sea, this whitewashed hamlet with signature green shutters remains a center of traditional salt harvesting. Wander its narrow lanes and admire the village's iconic black-and-white church spire, long a beacon for sailors navigating these shores.

On your return drive, pass through the harbor town of La Flotte-en-Ré and catch a glimpse of the 12th-century ruins of L'Abbaye des Châteliars, once among the region's most significant abbeys before being ravaged by war. Conclude your visit with a final scenic drive across this enchanting island back to your yacht.

Please note: Expect to walk just under a mile. This tour is suitable for guests in wheelchairs, but not all locations visited may be accessible. The order of sites visited may vary.

LA ROCHELLE TREASURES ON FOOT

- Admire the twin harbor towers of Saint-Nicolas and La Chaîne, which once defended the port with a chain stretched across the channel.
- Pass timber-framed houses, the ornate Town Hall, and La Rochelle's grand Law Courts before enjoying free time to explore.

DESCRIPTION

Venture into the heart of La Rochelle's Old Town for a guided walk through its maze of narrow streets, vaulted passageways and arcaded promenades. Along the way, your guide will reveal highlights such as the striking Porte de la Grosse Horloge, once the city's primary gateway, its clock tower rising above the old stone arch.

At the Old Harbor, admire the postcard-perfect scene of the twin towers guarding the port entrance: the Tour Saint-Nicolas and the Tour de la Chaîne, the latter named for the heavy chain once stretched across the channel to block unwanted ships. As you continue through the historic center, soak in the charm of timber-framed houses and elegant arcades, along with the ornate Town Hall, the Hôtel de la Bourse, and the stately Law Courts, whose Corinthian columns and detailed frieze showcase La Rochelle's rich architectural heritage. After your guided tour, enjoy free time to explore the shops, cafés or waterfront at your own pace before returning to the pier by coach.

Please note: Expect to walk just under a mile over cobblestones. This tour is not suitable for guests in wheelchairs or with limited mobility. The order of sites visited may vary.

FROM SAINTES TO CHÂTEAU LA ROCHE COURBON

HIGHLIGHTS

- Travel through La Rochelle's Old Harbor, passing the twin medieval towers that once defended its bustling maritime gateway.
- Visit Saintes' Cathedral of Saint-Pierre, blending Romanesque and neo-Classical styles, and learn of John Calvin's ties to the city.
- Explore the thousand-year-old Abbaye aux Dames and see the ancient Arch of Germanicus along the Charente River.
- Tour Château La Roche Courbon, with sumptuous salons, painted drawing rooms and vaulted kitchens preserved from centuries past.
- Stroll the château's formal gardens, where manicured parterres and tranquil ponds create a breathtaking setting among elegant terraces.

DESCRIPTION

Set off on a journey through some of western France's most captivating landmarks. Begin with a scenic drive through La Rochelle's Old Harbor, passing the twin medieval towers that once guarded its entrance, then continue south to the town of Saintes. In this quaint village, follow your guide into the historic center to visit the Cathedral of Saint-Pierre, where John Calvin once preached. Its Romanesque foundation and neo-Classical dome reflect centuries of architectural change. Nearby, visit the thousand-year-old Abbaye aux Dames, once home to Benedictine nuns until the French Revolution. Stroll along the Charente River to view the Arch of Germanicus, built in AD 19 and dedicated to Emperor Tiberius and his family.

After a lunch of regional specialties, continue to Château La Roche Courbon. Originally a 15th-century fortress, it was later transformed into an elegant manor with richly decorated salons, hand-painted drawing rooms, vaulted kitchens, and intimate bedchambers. Stroll through the terraced gardens, where manicured parterres, tranquil ponds, and fountains unfold with the impressive château as a dramatic backdrop.

Please note: Expect to walk just over a mile over cobblestones and steps. This tour is not suitable for guests in wheelchairs or with limited mobility.

LA ROCHELLE & CHÂTEAU LA PÉRAUDIÈRE

HIGHLIGHTS

- See La Rochelle's Old Harbor, where twin towers still guard the maritime entrance to this historic seafaring city.
- Stroll the cobbled streets and arcaded passageways of the Old Town, once a Protestant stronghold known as France's 'rebel city.'
- Pause at Saint-Sauveur Church and admire centuries-old façades that reflect La Rochelle's rich merchant past.
- Tour Château de La Péraudière, home to the Normandin-Mercier family and its exceptional Cognac aging cellars.
- Sample first-rate Cognacs and Pineau des Charentes, tasting the fruits of generations of distilling mastery in a unique setting.

DESCRIPTION

Step ashore for a brief transfer into the heart of La Rochelle, where a thousand years of history come to life. Known as the rebel city, La Rochelle embraced democracy early, electing its first mayor in 1199, and stood as a Protestant stronghold in Catholic France. As you begin your panoramic tour, take in the Old Harbor with its two imposing towers still guarding the harbor entrance. The coach pauses near Saint-Sauveur Church, where your guided walk begins. Stroll the cobbled streets, lined with arcades, vaulted passageways, and centuries-old porches that reflect the city's enduring character.

After exploring the historic center, travel a short distance to Château de La Péraudière, home to the Normandin-Mercier family since 1872. Situated near the once-bustling Cognac export hub of La Rochelle, the estate's natural climate creates ideal aging conditions. Inside the stone cellars, generations of expertise are preserved. Audrey Normandin welcomes you to tour the distillery and aging warehouses, where some barrels hold Cognacs matured for up to 50 years. Conclude your visit with a tasting of excellent Cognacs, along with Pineau des Charentes, a local fortified aperitif made by blending Cognac with fresh grape juice.

Please note: Expect to walk just under a mile, including a few steps at the castle. This tour is not suitable for guests in wheelchairs or with limited mobility.

BORDEAUX, FRANCE (1 OF 3)

PANORAMIC BORDEAUX & WINE CHÂTEAU (DAY 1)

HIGHLIGHTS

- Admire medieval icons like the Cailhau Gate, Big Bell and Saint-André Cathedral, site of Eleanor of Aquitaine's royal wedding.
- See architectural treasures including the Grand Theater, Palais Rohan and the Girondins Monument in Quinconces Square.
- Learn about the centuries-old traditions of Bordeaux winemaking as you travel through vineyard-covered countryside.
- Tour one of Bordeaux's renowned wine estates, exploring the cellars and sampling vintages that define the region's prestige.

DESCRIPTION

Set off on a scenic drive from the port and enjoy a panoramic introduction to Bordeaux, the illustrious city of wine. Travel along the Chartrons Riverfront, the historic cradle of the region's wine trade, and pass by architectural landmarks such as the 18th-century Place de la Bourse, the 15th-century Cailhau Gate, and the 14th-century Big Bell. Continue past Palais Rohan—now the City Hall—and admire the 13th-century Cathedral of Saint-André, where Eleanor of Aquitaine was married to Louis VII. Your route also includes Gambetta Square, Tourny Square, and a view of the elegant Grand Theater, designed by Victor Louis in 1773. Conclude your city drive at the vast Quinconces Square, home to the Monument to the Girondins.

Leaving the city behind, journey into the vineyard-clad countryside that surrounds Bordeaux. At a prestigious estate such as Château La Louvière, Bouscaut, Le Grand Verdus, or La Garde, enjoy a guided cellar visit and learn about the winemaking traditions that have made this region renowned around the world. Then indulge in a tasting of select wines, appreciating the character and craftsmanship that define Bordeaux vintages.

LES BASSINS DE LUMIÈRES IN BORDEAUX (DAY 1)

- Visit Bordeaux's Bassins de Lumières, a vast former WWII submarine base transformed into an immersive art center.

- Experience entire galleries of Van Gogh, Klimt, or other artists brought to life through synchronized light and sound.
- Marvel at the fusion of classical art and cutting-edge digital technology in a dramatic sensory environment.

DESCRIPTION

Depart the pier for a short transfer to Bordeaux's extraordinary Bassins de Lumières, where art surrounds you in a breathtaking immersive experience. Inside this vast World War II submarine base, once built to house German U-boats, monumental projections transform massive concrete walls and still waters into living canvases.

As you walk along elevated gangways and wide quaysides, masterworks of renowned painters unfold in vibrant, animated sequences, accompanied by a dramatic musical score. Entire galleries of Van Gogh, Klimt, or other masters sweep across the space, their brushstrokes magnified and set in motion, while mirrored reflections ripple across the enormous basins.

The exhibitions rotate throughout the year, blending classical masterpieces with contemporary digital art in synchronized light and sound. Rather than viewing individual artworks, you'll step into entire worlds of color, movement, and music that transform the very architecture of the space.

BEST OF BORDEAUX (DAY 1)

- Drive along the Chartrons Riverfront and see landmarks such as the Place de la Bourse, Cailhau Gate and Big Bell.

- Walk through Old Bordeaux to the Grand Théâtre, an 18th-century gem considered one of Europe's finest theaters.
- Rejoin your coach and conclude the tour with a drive past Quinconces Square and the Monument to the Girondins.

DESCRIPTION

Set out on a combined panoramic and walking tour of Bordeaux, a UNESCO World Heritage Site celebrated for its architectural harmony and rich history.
